



SUMMER SCHOOL



Dear Parents,

I am pleased to announce that the Connellsville Area School District will be offering a summer school program to offer additional support to students in the subjects of either math or reading during the month of July. This program is similar to the elementary tutoring program which was held during the 2009-2010 school year. The children will be placed in small groups and receive direct instruction.

Eligibility requirements to participate in the program are as follows:

- Student attended grades 2-5 during the 2009-2010 school year.
- The student must be performing at basic or below basic on assessments in math or reading.
- Or have an average classroom grade of a D or below in math or reading.
- Must be able to attend three full weeks of summer school from July 12-July 30.
- Must have ability to stay two hours after school to complete assessment prior to the end of the school year.
- A signed registration form must be returned to your child's principal no later than 3:00 p.m. on May 14, 2010.
- Parent must provide transportation for his/her child.

IF SPACE IS LIMITED, STUDENTS WILL BE SELECTED BY NEED.

Classes will be held at three host sites within Connellsville Area School District from July 12-July 30, 2010: Dunbar Township Elementary, Zachariah Connell Elementary, and Springfield Township Elementary. Students who attend Dunbar Township and Dunbar Boro will attend Dunbar Township for summer school. Students who attend Springfield Elementary and Clifford N Pritts will attend summer school at Springfield Elementary. Those students attending Zachariah Connell, South Side, Bullskin, and Connellsville Township will attend Zachariah Connell. Class start time will be 9:30 a.m. and will end at 11:30 a.m. A free lunch will be available in the school cafeteria immediately following classes.
